**YB SENATOR DATO' SRI ABDUL WAHID OMAR SPEAKS AT RSOG SEMINAR ON RMK 11 –  
WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO THE MEN-IN-THE-STREET?**

**Putrajaya, 26 June** – With the theme ‘Anchoring Growth on People’, the RMK 11 which was tabled by the Prime Minister on 21 May 2015 outlined six strategic thrusts -(i) strengthening inclusivity towards an equitable society; (ii) increasing prosperity for all; (iii) accelerate the development of human capital to developed countries; (iv) moving towards green growth to enhance the sustainability and durability; (v) strengthening the infrastructure to support economic development; and (vi) to engineer economic growth to increase prosperity. The Plan focuses on increasing the people's income to enable Malaysia to achieve the status of high income nation by 2020 as we move into the final five-year stretch.

A relatively stronger interests shown for RMK 11 is understandable in light of a tougher economic environment and a more affluent society. Hence, the seminar today entitled RMK 11 – What Does it Mean to the Men-in-the-Street”? with YB Senator Dato’ Sri Abdul Wahid Omar, organised by Razak School of Government (RSOG) was indeed apt and timely. The seminar did not only provide a platform for participants to discuss at length on the RMK 11 from the men-in-the-street perspectives; fairly and objectively, but it also gave them the opportunity to get the first-hand information from the Minister himself and to answer any questions they may have.
